Hartley Trust in its Second Term of Service A Landmark in the History of Hartley College, Point Pedro was the coming together of delegates of all the Past Pupils' Associations of Hartley College spread across the Globe to inaugurate the Hartley Trust that will Coordinate the efforts of all PPA's around the globe and that of other agencies to develop Hartley.

This took place at Hotel Galadari on 29th of July, 2002 under the chairmanship of the then President of Colombo branch, Mr. V. Jeyarajah. The covenant outlining the objective accepted at this meeting runs like this "The joint meeting of all branches of Hartley Past College Pupils' Association shall appoint seven members as independent trustees from among the Hartlevites in Sri Lanka, to receive, act, monitor and report on the flow of funds as entrusted by various branches in accordance with the wishes of the branches for the benefit of Hartley College Point Pedro"

Five trustees were elected to serve for a period of 3 years, namely Mr. Shan Shanmuganathan, Mr. Chella Pathmanathan and Mr. V. Rajanayagam from Colombo; Mr. D.R. Arumainayagam and Mr. V. Sriskandarajah from Jaffna. The presidents of Colombo branch and Point Pedro branch will also be members of the Trust. In addition, the Principal of Hartley College will be an Ex- officio member of the Trust.

Three years have passed and during this period the constitution has been legally registered giving legal status to the Trust; thereby making the Trust the guardian, coordinator and executor for assets of Hartley.

On July 29th this year after the first term of three years new trustees took office with the consent of all branches of Hartley PPAs.

Members will be aware that the Hostel has been destroyed by the artillery fire during the armed conflict period.

### NEWS OF TSUNAMI RELIEF

We reported in our earlier editions, the relief work undertaken by Hartleyites by personally going to the affected areas and spending their valuable time and money.

We are glad to report on another such service by another of our member Rev. Dr. Dharmarajah from USA. Members will remember him as the guest of honour few years back at our AGM He took the initiative to visit Vadamaradchy along with his mission people. On their visit to the three worst affected areas in Vadamaradchy, Munai, Kudathanai and Amban, he found that the surviving members of the families were staying in makeshift camps and they have no means of starting their life. He found that they needed a means of transport. This resulted in his team purchasing immediately 375 bicycles, one for each family, so that they can be mobile and try to re-start their lives.

#### COLOMBO BRANCH HELPS TSUNAMI AFFECTED STUDENTS OF HARTLEY

Two students who were affected by Tsunami Mas. Mahendran Thilakson (Grade 6), and Mas. Sivagnam Sakthivel were given by Colombo branch an initial payment of Rs 25 000/each and a monthly payment of Rs 1000/- from June 2005 onwards.

TRUST CHAIMAN ARRANGES DONATION OF WATER PURIFICATION UNIT TO HARTLEY

Trust chairman Mr. Shan Shanmuganathan has arranged with an NGO for the donation of water purification unit to Hartley.

We reported earlier that there was 4 feet of water in Hartley. One of the consequences was that the well water on which the college depends became unsuitable not only for drinking but also for laboratory work. Trust also has arranged for the replacement of the motor and water pump which were damaged.
